

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

What is included in All-Star Basketball?

Each player will be placed on a team of 8 to 12 players. Each player will receive a team jersey, practice time with their team, Team hoop talk materials, Play-off tournament, with trophies for division winners, certificates and awards.

Does the league cost anything?

We ask each player to pay \$20 for the cost of the end of season banquet. The banquet includes a catered meal, entertainment, awards, etc.

Can anybody play? Are there any restrictions?

Players must be between the ages of 10 and 18. You cannot play if you do not have a parent or guardian signature. All players must agree to the league code of conduct. There are no restrictions based on skill level. The league is open to all Rochester youth. All players must participate in the Hoop Talk Character discussion following practice.

Who is youth for Christ? I have never heard of them.
